Moving forward...



Coming Up

Alan Linton Shelter - The shelter on Degrange Street is a year around service offering overnight accommodations for those in There is a full-time staff, including security, but volunteers are needed to help with signing clients in, and with distribution of items they might need: soap, cup of noodles, socks, etc. The times volunteers are needed are 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm, and most people sign up for either the first or last two hours of that time. Many churches sign up as a group and take an entire week. The Missions Committee is hoping that WUMC would choose to do likewise and participate in this outreach opportunity. If we get a nice response, we'd need to schedule a training session before scheduling our week at the shelter. If you're interested, please contact Jim Mullins at 301-845-6596.



Fall Festival – is Saturday, *October 26* from Noon to 3:00. This has become a Fall tradition and is our largest community outreach. Volunteers will be needed to help with set up, clean up, and running activities. This event is scheduled "Rain or Shine".

North Point Veterans Program – of Hagerstown is a program WUMC has generously supported for the past several years. They offer housing support services to homeless veterans who wish to achieve residential stability. Their focus on service includes:

- Quality recovery-oriented services designed to support sobriety;
- Employment services and training and support in developing independent living skills such as money management;

- A connection for working in close coordination with the Department of Veteran's Affairs;
- Clients usually stay at North Point for six or seven months.

From October 20 to November 11, we will be collecting donations to support this program for veterans. These are the items requested to help their program run:

Twin sheets Bedding in a Bag Hand towels Small laundry baskets

Bath towels Wash cloths

Toiletries (regular sized are preferred but trial sizes are accepted)

Pillows

Glade Valley Community Services

Glade Valley Food Bank shelves are getting bare. Donations and sponsored food drives drop in the summer, and our inventory gets used up. The Food Bank provides food for about 125 family visits per month; that is about 5,000 pounds of food each month. This is about 200 boxes/cans of each item on the list of items that are packed for each client. Larger families get more than one box of each item per visit.

The Giving Tree this month will benefit the Glade Valley Food Bank. Take a tag (or 2) and return the requested items to the bin by the tree. Let's fill up the bare shelves!



Items most urgently needed are peanut butter and tuna; these shelves are bare. Other places where the shelves are starting to look empty include macaroni and cheese, Hamburger Helper, canned fruit, boxed potatoes (mashed, scalloped, etc.), soup and canned peas, cereal, spaghetti/pasta, spaghetti sauce, baked beans.

Did you know?

Walmart gift cards are also welcome; they are used to purchase eggs and other items needed by the Food Bank. Gift cards can be put in the offering plate. But if you do the shopping for us, that is even more helpful!

Here is another way to support the Food Bank that several donors have used this summer. *Order items online* at Walmart or Amazon. Be sure to look for the free shipping on orders over a certain amount!

If you order from a tag on the Giving Tree, write a note on it that the items have been ordered online. Return tags in the offering plate.

Volunteers are also needed weekdays to help with inventory, deliveries and picking up donations from area grocery stores. Volunteer shoppers are welcome. - 1. From our website, https://walkersvilleumc.org, select "Giving"
- 2. Next select the *green box* in the middle of page, "*online giving*".

 You should now be on our online giving form with our church's picture & name on it.
- 3. Select "Give Now" to give without creating an account or "Sign In" & "Register for an Account".
- 4. Follow the online instructions, feel free to call me if you have any difficulties, 301-676-4379.
- 5. You may donate to General Fund or Designated Giving (Trustees, ASP, Food Bank, Flowers, etc.).

ShareFaith is set up to charge a 3% convenience fee to cover costs of using a Credit or Debit card, however currently the system defaults to charge this for all types of donations, if you are using a checking or savings account (ACH transaction), you may uncheck the 3% Processing Fee box.

EMAIL BLAST REMINDERS:

Just a reminder when asking the office to send a church-wide Email Blast for news and information, the email blasts are **only** sent to the family's designated 'Household' email. There is <u>only one</u> Household email per family. If you need to send information to specific individuals, a church-wide email may not reach everyone. For example: emails being sent to committee members should be sent to them directly, not via a church-wide email.

Reminders to all members: Please make sure the office is using the email address you want as your Household email to receive the church-wide Email Blasts. For example: if you are not currently receiving the Saddlebag, your Household email address may need to be updated.

Communication of Church Events

The following protocol was approved by Church Council to communicate church events and building usage:

Any event that affects the body of the church (including events which are taking place outside the facility, such as at someone's home or local restaurant, retreat, etc.) or use of the facilities should be on the church calendar. Every event, meeting, outside contractor, in-house repair that may affect use of the facility or may create a conflict with other events MUST be communicated in writing (preferably via email) to the Administrative Assistant. The email should be sent to secretary@walkersvilleumc.org and should include space being requested, date and time of event, any need for prep (decorating, food prep, etc.), any post-event need (such as paint drying time, clean-up, removal of decorations, etc.). This will allow for notification of the appropriate people to assure the facility is clean and available with no conflicts. Your cooperation is appreciated.
